Ignite City Church: Core Beliefs

God.

We believe in the eternal + triune God as revealed to us in the Scriptures (Father, Son, and Holy Spirit), each person of the Trinity being fully God and yet collectively being one God.

The Father.

We believe that the Father is the eternal and sovereign Creator; the faithful, good, infinite and holy Father who loved the world so much that he sent his Son, Jesus, in order to rescue those who surrender to the Lordship of Jesus.

Jesus.

We believe that Jesus is the Christ, fully God and fully man, begotten of the Holy Spirit, born of a virgin, sinless in word, thought, and deed. We believe that he was crucified in our place, was buried, and was resurrected three days later, having victory of sin and death, and now graciously and passionately offers

As we walk with and abide in Jesus, through regular time spent with him reading His word, the Holy Spirit reveals his heart + will for us.

Humanity + Sin.

We believe that every person is created in the very image of God and therefore has intrinsic value, designed and fashioned by God to bring him glory. However, we also believe that because of our rebellion which started in the garden with Adam and Eve, every person is inherently sinful and in rebellion against God, in need of reconciliation with God that only comes through confessing one's sin and placing one's trust in Jesus as Lord--a salvation that is by grace through faith.

Becoming a follower of Jesus.

We believe that being made right with God is a gracious gift that is received by grace through faith, not the result of works, by surrendering to Jesus as Lord by repenting from sin and placing one's faith and trust in the saving work of Jesus.

We believe that the process of discipleship is a life-long journey and loving relationship with our Creator whose desire is to conform us into the likeness of his Son through the sanctifying working of the Holy Spirit.

The Church.

We believe that the church is the community of Christ-followers, forgiven and reconciled to God through Jesus, whose mission is to fulfill the Great Commission (to make, baptize and instruct disciples) and the Great Commandment (to love God and people), ushering in the reality of reconciliation, both between God and people as well as between people and each other while edifying the the church through the use of

spiritual gifts.

Eternity.

We believe in the personal and visible return of Jesus. We believe that every person is created for eternity, either eternity with God for those who have been reconciled to God through the redemptive work of Jesus, or eternity away from God in hell for those who do not receive God's forgiveness through surrendering to the Lordship of Jesus.

Statement on Marriage + Sexuality.

We believe that God created people in his very image with distinct biological sexes--male and female. This means that men and women have the same intrinsic value because of the value of their Creator. While roles may not be the same, the value and calling of men and women are seen as equitable. Because of this, Ignite City Church will intentionally stand for life and the equality of each person regardless of gender, race, socioeconomic status, or of one's background or present life circumstances.

We believe that God designed sex to be enjoyed within the marriage relationship as defined by Scripture as being one man and one woman. Therefore, any sexual relationship outside the biblical definition of marriage is sin.

While we recognize that many people do not feel like their experienced gender is aligned with God's intention for them, we do not believe in resolving the tensions through medical assistance or a new identity founded on one's personal preference or experience.
